Foundations of Novell Open Enterprise Server NetWare

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QUESTION 1

You're planning the network file system for an OES NetWare server. Your server has a mirrored 40 GB SCSI-3 hard disk drive array. On the array, you've decided to create one NSS volume named SYS. In addition to the default operating system directories created when NetWare is installed, you want to create a directory named USERS off the volume root where each user will have his or her home directory. You also want to create a directory named SPOOL off the volume root where print jobs waiting to be printed on the network printer will reside. Finally, you want to create a directory named APPS off the volume root where network- distributed applications will reside. Does this design meet with Novell guidelines?

- A. Yes, all Novell guidelines have been met.
- B. No, NSS doesn't support mirrored drive arrays
- C. No, NSS doesn't support SCSI-3 hard disk drives.
- D. No, the user's home directory should be named HOME.

QUESTION 2

Your company has three regional offices. Each office has its own network administrator. Each administrator's user object has been assigned the Supervisor right to their respective Organizational Unit objects; allowing them to perform all administrative tasks in the container. Today, you accidentally deleted the administrator's user object (named LMorgan) for the Salt Lake City office. To fix the problem, you've decided to simply re-create the object, using the same name, in the same context where it was before. Will LMorgan still have the Supervisor right to her Organizational Unit object?

- A. No, eDirectory requires globally unique object names and LMorgan has already been used.
- B. No, the LMorgan user name will be retained in the server's eDirectory cache for 72 hours.
- C. Yes, LMorgan will have all the rights she had before because the same object name and context was used.
- D. No, the administrator will lose her rights because the new user object has a new value assigned to the GUID property.

QUESTION 3

One of your clients owns a company that runs three shifts of employees each day. To save money, the client has purchased only enough workstations for a single shift of employees. Each employee shares his or her computer with two other employees who work different shifts. The client has a very high employee turn-over rate. The average



employee only works there for 6-9 months. Based on this information, which of the following security policies should you consider implementing? (Choose 2.)

- A. Force periodic password changes.
- B. Use a volume other than SYS for home directories.
- C. Restrict user logins times to the user's shift hours.
- D. Avoid assigning rights through the All Properties option.
- E. Assign file attributes in addition to file trustee assignments.

QUESTION 5

Your company has four regional offices. You are the overall administrator for the entire organization. Each regional office has its own network administrator. You allow yourself and each regional administrator to use the Admin user object to manage the eDirectory tree. You have configured each user object to require unique passwords and to limit grace logins to 3. All user objects for temporary employees have an expiration date assigned to them. Do these policies conform to Novell's security recommendations.?

- A. Yes, all Novell security recommendations have been met.
- B. No, you shouldn't allow users objects to have grace logins.
- C. No, you shouldn't assign user accounts to temporary employees.
- D. No, you shouldn't use multiple network administrators for the same tree.
- E. No, each container administrator should have their own user object with specific rights assigned.
