Adobe InDesign CS5 ACE Exam

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### QUESTION 1

Mark is a regular user of InDesign CS5. He has an XML file, a DTD file, and a completed InDesign file from a previous XML project. He wants to use the same XML tags and structure in a new InDesign document.

Which method will he use to reproduce the tag names in the new InDesign file?

- A. Choose Window > Tag > select Load DTD from the Tags Panel menu > select a DTD file to import, and click Open.
- B. Choose Window > Tag > select Load Tags from the Tags Panel menu and then select the previous InDesign file and click Open to load the XML tags.
- C. Select the previous InDesign file > select the Autotag option from the Tag panel menu.
- D. Choose Window > Tag > select Load Tags from the Structure panel menu > select the XML file > click Open.

Correct Answer: B

To use the same XML tags and structure in a new InDesign document from a previous file, Mark will choose Window > Tag > select Load Tags from the Tags Panel menu > select the previous InDesign file, and click Open to load the XML tags.

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### QUESTION 2

Which of the following formats are NOT supported by InDesign? Each correct answer represents a complete solution. Choose all that apply.

- A. AutoCAD Document Exchange Format (DXF)
- B. Computer Graphics Metafile (CGM)
- C. CorelDraw
- D. DrawCorel

Correct Answer: ABC

The following formats are not supported by InDesign:

1. AutoCAD Document Exchange Format (DXF)
  2. Computer Graphics Metafile (CGM)
  3. CorelDraw
  4. Eastman Kodak's Photo CD
  5. Scalable Vector Graphics (SVG)
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### QUESTION 3



You are preparing a document for printing in InDesign CS5. Which of the following options in the Mark and Bleed pane of the Print dialog box specifies how far from the edge of the page will InDesign draw printer's marks?

- A. Weight
- B. Crop Marks
- C. Bleed Marks
- D. Offset

Correct Answer: D

The Offset option adds fine (hairline) rules that define the amount of additional area to the image outside the defined page size.

Answer: B is incorrect. The Crop Marks option adds fine (hairline) horizontal and vertical rules that define where the page should be trimmed. Crop marks also help in registering (align) one color separation to another.

#### QUESTION 4

You are creating a document. You have to export content of this document to an XML file. So, you are tagging page items.

Which of the following statements are true about tagging? Each correct answer represents a complete solution. Choose all that apply.

- A. You cannot tag text or images on a master page.
- B. You can apply only one tag to a graphics frame.
- C. You cannot tag a group of objects.
- D. You cannot tag a footnote

Correct Answer: BCD

When you are tagging page items, you should note the following points: You can apply tags to stories as well as to text within stories. You can apply only one tag to a story. When you tag a frame in a threaded story, all the other frames in the story, along with any overset text, are assigned the same tag. You can apply only one tag to a graphics frame. When you tag a graphics frame, InDesign records a reference to the location of the graphic. You cannot tag a group of objects. To tag an item that is part of a group, use the Direct Selection tool to select the item. When you tag text within a tagged element (such as a paragraph within a story), it appears as a child of the existing element in the Structure pane. You can tag text or images on a master page, but only one instance of the corresponding element appears in the Structure pane regardless of how many times the item appears on the document pages.

#### QUESTION 5

You are creating a book in InDesign CS5. You want to replace an existing chapter with another document.

What will you do to accomplish this task?

- A. Choose Remove Document from the flyout menu or click the Remove Document iconic button (the - icon) from the



bottom of the panel.

B. Select the Automatic Document Conversion menu option in the book panel's flyout menu.

C. Choose File >New > Book.

D. Select the chapter in the book panel and then choose Replace Document from the flyout menu.

Correct Answer: D

To replace an existing chapter with another document, select the chapter in the book panel and then choose Replace Document from the flyout menu.

Answer: A is incorrect. If you choose Remove Document from the flyout menu or click the Remove Document iconic button (the - icon) from the bottom of the panel, it will delete chapters from the book.

Answer: B is incorrect. If the Automatic Document Conversion menu option is selected in the book panel's flyout menu, InDesign will convert all chapters created in the earlier versions of InDesign into the InDesign CS5 format.

Answer: C is incorrect. If you Choose File >New > Book, the New Book dialog box will open.

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
