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### QUESTION 1

Which of the following orders would the physician prescribe for the patient with retinal detachment?

- A. Bathroom privileges
- B. Head of bed up 45 degrees
- C. Eye patch to affected eye
- D. Dark glasses to read or watch television

Correct Answer: C

The physician would order an eye patch to the affected eye. This decreases movement of the eye and prevents further damage to the eye. The physician may limit activity until the eye can be repaired.

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### QUESTION 2

Which of the following would the nurse avoid documenting when an error has occurred with a patient?

- A. Names of witnesses
- B. Interventions performed
- C. Physician notified
- D. Incident report submitted

Correct Answer: D

The nurse would avoid documenting in the patient's record that an incident report has been submitted. The medical record belongs to the patient and should include all information related to the incident. The incident report belongs to the hospital and should not be referred to in the medical record. Incident reports are used to examine the issue and improve the quality of care for all patients.

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### QUESTION 3

You are admitting a child with partial and full thickness burns over 35% of the body. The priority intervention for this child would be:

- A. Morphine
- B. Restricting fluids
- C. Nasogastric tube
- D. Foley catheter

Correct Answer: D



This child will need a foley catheter. This is to insure that accurate output can be tracked each hour. All other options are inappropriate for the child at this time.

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#### QUESTION 4

If you were caring for a child who had croup that had to be in a cool mist tent, what action would you need to take if the child became frightened and began crying consistently?

- A. Notify the physician and get an order for sedation.
- B. Have the mother make the child stay in the tent.
- C. Give the child a toy to play with in the tent.
- D. Place the child in mom\\'s lap and direct cool mist over the child\\'s face.

Correct Answer: D

The nurse would want to place the child in the mom\\'s lap and direct cool mist over the child\\'s face. Crying will aggravate laryngospasm and increase hypoxia. This will lead to airway obstruction so it is important to decrease crying quickly.

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#### QUESTION 5

You will be working with an unlicensed staff member this shift. Which of the following should be priority before delegating care to the staff member?

- A. Assessing whether the staff member is competent to perform the skill
- B. Preparing written instructions on how to perform skill
- C. Gathering supplies
- D. Informing the patient that an unlicensed staff member will perform the care

Correct Answer: A

The RN should assess the unlicensed staff member\\'s competency to complete the task assigned to them before delegating. Written instructions are not necessary if the staff is competent to complete the skill. Supplies will need to be gathered once an assignment is made. The staff member performing the procedure needs to give his or her name and title to the patient before performing the task.
