The chain of custody dictates the way in which a sample will be taken and how it will be guarded against tampering before, during and after testing. Make sure you know the regulations in place and follow them closely, otherwise you may be called upon to explain why you did not.

QUESTION 3

Which of these is the baseline procedure for preventing the spread of disease in medical institutions?

- A. Wearing gloves
- B. Wearing gowns
- C. Washing hands
- D. Wearing masks

Correct Answer: C

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Hand-to-hand and hand to surface contact is the most common way for infection to spread in medical institutions.

Not everyone can wear gloves all day, but everyone can wash their hands thoroughly before and after patient contact, after using the bathroom, before eating food etc.

Make sure you follow the correct procedure at all times and encourage colleagues, visitors and patients to do the same.

Which of these is used to drain fluid from the body?

A catheter is used to drain fluid from the body. It may be inserted in a body cavity, duct or vein.

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
