Correct Answer: A

Some drugs can be administered transdermally via a patch on the skin.

This can be a good option for patients who are frightened of needles and for those requiring a steady release of a drug over time.

#### **QUESTION 5**

What is the best way to answer a telephone in a medical office?

- A. With the name of the office
- B. With your name
- C. With the name of the office and your name
- D. With "Hello"

Correct Answer: C

When answering a telephone in a formal situation, give both the name of the office/institution and your name: "Smith Clinic, Jane Doe speaking, how can I help?" This lets the caller know they have reached the right place and creates a human relationship between you.

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
